

Teachers from Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten, primary and upper grade classrooms as well as a Behavior Structured Program at Monte Vista Middle School applied for the grants. The grant money will be used for herbs, seeds and starter plants, irrigation repairs, compost and soil amendment. We were able to award grants to all 6 schools for a total of \$1,000. The teachers will receive the checks by the end of the month so they and their students can begin planting!

The club was on summer hiatus at the time but when we resumed, Jan sought me out and welcomed me warmly. The first event I attended was making Hypertufa planters in her yard on Esteban. She took me on a walk through the property and give me cuttings of succulents to start my garden. This photo is from the 2019 Holiday Party. When the pandemic hit in 2020, I did some grocery shopping for her and we would sit in the yard on Valle Lindo and visit (6 feet apart, of course). Jan was a force of nature and will be missed.


